Introduction


- In Uganda, Under USAID/BETTER OUTCOMES OVC program World Education/Bantwana Initiative delivers integrated OVC and HIV services to 132,000 OVC and caregivers to build resilience and contribute to Uganda's 95 95 95 goals
- BETTER OUTCOMES delivers services across 22 districts with 8 implementing partners, and government and clinic stakeholders
- Services are coordinated and delivered through a tested community case management model anchored by parasocial workers (PSWs) linked to formal district protection systems






The Problem

In 2016, 238,629 child abuse related cases were reported to the national Child Helpline (CHL)






How stakeholders use the CUG

Impact of the CUG

- Improved response to emergencies
- Strengthened follow up and coordination of cases; referrals and community clinic linkages enhanced
- Strengthened integration with National Child Protection Helpline (116)
